W.I.S. with OOG shipment for Power Plant project

W.I.S. have recently arranged a OOG shipment as part of a power plant project in Aden, Yemen.


W.I.S. have been entrusted with the execution of the 264mw Aden Power Plant (Phase 1) near Aden in the Republic of Yemen. This first phase out of four consists of approximately 50,000frt of cargo including heavy lifts of up to 220mtn.

The latest shipment in the project consisted of 10 fully assembled storage tanks (as photographed), each with diameters of between 15.0-16.5m, heights in excess of 10m and weights between 60-70tn. Including the ancillaries and additional other cargo, the total volume amounted to almost 25,000frt, one of the largest ever undertaken by W.I.S.

It took W.I.S. 2 months of planning and the shipment was loaded on MV. Maria from SAL geared with 2 x 350tn and 1 x 250tn cranes which was especially chartered to undertake the exclusive voyage from the UAE to the Port of Aden.

Congratulation to W.I.S. on the successful, safe and reliable handling of this major shipment for an important project!

O&S Shipping & Nunner handle two Helicopters

PCN partners, O&S Shipping in Malta and Nunner Logistics in the Netherlands have worked together to handle the transport of 2 special helicopters (complete with rotor blades and engines) as pictured.

The helicopters were to be transported from the Netherlands to Malta and after careful discussions with Nunner Logistics and all relevant parties, O&S Shipping secured the business.

After loading and lashing on flat-bed trucks in Arnhem in the Netherlands, all the cargo was delivered to Rotterdam Port and loaded on the container vessel, APL Raffles, for sailing to Malta Freeport.

In Malta, after discharging, the helicopters were moved to a holding warehouse before the convoy continued to the final destination at Malta International Airport escorted by Malta Traffic Police motorcycles and avoiding the Safi Tunnel.

The project ran smoothly thanks to O&S Shipping and Nunner Logistics with all cargo delivered safely.

Megalift report successful transportation of two Gas Turbines

Megalift are pleased to report they have handled the successful transportation of two gas turbines in Malaysia. The impressive photos in the gallery below show the operations to move the world's largest and the first GE 9HA.02 gas turbines in Malaysia. It is also known to be the current most efficient heavy-duty gas turbine in the world.

Each gas turbine weighs 436tn with dimensions of 11.40 x 5.10 x 5.20. Ms Atikah (Overseas Agency Development Coordinator at Megalift) comments: "We received the gas turbines, that had come from France, at Pasir Gudang Port, located at the southern region of the Malaysian peninsula. They are crucial components of the 'Track 4A: 1440mw Combined Cycled Power Plant' in Pasir Gudang, Johor. Each unit was taken through a distance of approximately 5km, an extended route to avoid several overhead restrictions. Margins at both edges of the road were narrow and it was especially challenging to turn at tight junctions. Timely traffic control coupled with our experience and familiarity of the route contributed to a smooth operation."

"Since 2018, Megalift has been entrusted to move a large number of shipments for the Track 4A Project. They have comprised of various cargo ranging from small structures to over-dimensional transformers, generator stators and gas turbines. We're excited to cross many more milestones in the project logistics scene in Malaysia."

Our 2019 Annual Summit in Botswana

We were excited to hold our 9th Annual Summit from 17-19 November 2019 at Gaborone International Convention Centre (GICC) at The Grand Palm Resort in Botswana.



The event, held in the heart of Africa, gave Members the opportunity to understand, explore and secure business in the expanding marketplace. Representation from the region included Cameroon, Djibouti, Egypt, Ghana, Ivory Coast, Kenya, Namibia, Nigeria, South Africa and Tanzania.

This year, we introduced several new features including saying goodbye to environmentally unfriendly, printed schedules by developing our own Event Web App, where delegates schedules were readily available on their mobile devices.

A key feature was one-to-one messaging so that they could engage with each other before, during and after the gathering. They were also able to make notes against each 1-2-1 meeting that only they could see.

Time in the meeting room was predominantly 1-2-1 meetings, where delegates from over 55 countries exchanged information, reviewed current and upcoming government and private projects in the manufacturing, oil and gas, infrastructure, construction, power and energy sectors.

Another exciting addition to the event was 4 exclusive Infovideos, recorded especially for PCN by industry expert Marco van Daal. The first video was a thought-provoking case study of the installation of a huge floating granite sphere. The challenge was finding the best solution to lift a 15 ton round ball without touching the bottom. The second video revealed the most common mistake when executing a project, so obvious yet so underestimated that even NASA made the mistake resulting in a 5year investigation. The third video was an exciting case study where tandem lift operators could not see each other and at a certain point, could not see the 30-ton silo cargo either - operating blind solely on the instructions given by radio. The fourth



video covered the important topic of skidding and addressed the various systems, what they consist of, what to look out for and what the latest trends are.

Logistics Director at OMA Group, Mr Ian Treder gave an informative presentation regarding the challenges and benefits of working in Africa. Ian has over 30 years' experience in the shipping and logistics industry and is currently involved in business development, port activities and inland transportation in Africa for the OMA Group, predominately focused on West Africa.

We also welcomed Special Guests, Este De La Hunt and Sharon Cilliers of CargoWise One, with whom we recently formed an exclusive partnership which opens a range of benefits and discounts for PCN Members.


Next, was the Innovation Award of the Year.

Gaziantep is located at the Western tip of the South-Eastern region of Anatolia and at the North-Western tip of Mesopotamia. The city is one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world with a history dating back to the Palaeolithic period (site of Doliche) and is home to Hittite, Roman, Byzantine, Seljug and Ottoman layers. Due to its special location on the Silk Road, the city has grown rapidly after it passed into Ottoman reign in 1516. During this period, the city became a centre where not only goods and money but also beliefs, traditions, thoughts and scientific knowledge were exchanged. Thus, the city created a unique multicultural social structure which is also strongly reflected in the gastronomic culture. With the support of the climate condition the gastronomic culture of Gaziantep gained strength and reached over 400 dishes with the rich fruits. vegetables, spices, nuts and animal products of the region.

Gaziantep has become a regional centre and the top ten fastest growing cities in the world with its strong cultural, agricultural and commercial structure as well as the young and educated population. The city

embers in Turkey, Element International carries out about 10% of the total export of Turkey. With a population of 1.89 million, the city has an unemployment ratio of only about 6.9%. The city owns the 5th largest organized industry zone in Turkey which employs some 130,000 people with exports to 177 countries. As a sign of its rapid development, Gaziantep airport attendance has increased from 223,303 people to 2,163,124 in the last 11 years. The city has 3 universities and has developed strong economic and cultural relationships all over the world. The first phase of the Istanbul Airport, which is the largest infrastructure project in the history of the Turkish Republic, opened for service on October 29th 2018. Since April 6th 2019, the airport is operational and at full capacity. Covering an area of 76.5 million sqm, the new airport serves as a global hub between Asia, Africa and Europe. Istanbul Airport has been honoured with one of Global Traveler's Leisure Lifestyle Awards in the 'Outstanding Innovation' category. The publication, which is among the most prestigious in the global tourism sector, also picked Istanbul Airport for its 'Special Achievement Award'. The facility is eventually expected to achieve a capacity of 200 million passengers.

Situated only five hours flight away from the Europe, the Middle East, Central Asia, North and East Europe, Turkey's geographical position attributes a strategic significance to cargo and logistics operations. Because of its strategic geographical position, the investments of the national and international companies continuously increase in Turkey so the goal

of Istanbul Airport is to become one of the largest cargo hubs worldwide and significantly contribute to the Turkish economy. Whilst the compounded annual growth rate (CAGR) of cargo operations had increased 18.7% between 2009 and 2017, the compounded annual growth rate of air transport movement (total landing and take off movements of aircraft) increased 5.5%. The Cargo and Logistics Centre within the new Istanbul Airport covers an area of 1.4 million sqm and the bonded and unbonded warehouse facilities covering a total of 200,000sqm will be established.

The Cargo and Logistics Centre consists of several significant national and international companies, which offer cargo, logistics and temporary storage. The parking positions of the centre, which can be docked by over 30 wide-bodied cargo aircraft at the same time, is located just in front of the warehouses. The efficient and effective operation infrastructure facilitates the access from these locations to the passenger terminals and remote parking stands. The functionality of the structure, which passes beneath the runways and taxiways through the service tunnels at the airside without being disrupted by the aircraft traffic, is praiseworthy.

The cargo city within the Istanbul Airport will house all warehouses, agency offices, customs offices and all cargo and logistics operations. These coils are created to be the most efficient and high-quality way to transport gas and oil for any field resources and give excellent results to scouting companies. They are for one of the most powerful and advanced projects in Colombia using highquality products and first class technology.


Once the cargo arrives at the terminal in Houston, we unload the coils for the surveyor processes to check the entire cargo status and confirm they are ready to be loaded onto the vessel. One the biggest challenges during these shipments is the fixed origin procedures to pick up the entire



cargo at the same time. The shipper is one of the biggest in the Houston area and they have more than 100 truckers waiting at the beginning of the day. Once we have fixed the vessel's arrival into port, we can load just one coil per truck so for 42 coils (we usually pick up 70 coils per shipment), it is a big task for coordination and accurate logistics processes to complete the loading.

The most frequent way to load the cargo for a more efficient destination procedure is always loading the cargo on the first vessel deck as this allows for a faster unloading process bearing in mind that Colombian terminals have very expensive charges and require short times to complete all processes. So, for every shipment, we carefully confirm that the carrier has this space on the right vessel to transport the cargo.

If the origin process were a real challenge, the destination procedures are even more unpredictable with hard conditions because Colombian terminals are not as advanced and developed for this kind of project cargo. However, with our experience, when the cargo arrives in Colombia, we smoothly coordinate with different terminals and personnel for the unloading process, as well as arranging all cranes and machinery needed to transfer the cargo to trucks while the customs processes are completed and the cargo can begin the journey to the final destination.



For this particular shipment, the cargo was delivered at origin just with four days before cut off but our partners at LEMAN made extra efforts to complete within time. They got extra time with the terminal for the cargo to arrive, make the surveyor origin processes, and load the cargo on the vessel, all almost simultaneously. Then, after the booking confirmation was confirmed for a terminal in Colombia and in the middle of transit time, we had to change the unloading port because the original destination had 5 bulk carriers trying to unload and we couldn't get the right window so we changed the destination and moved entire the logistics process so we could manage the unloading process on time. After we got the customs green light, we began to transfer the cargo to the final destination point but as the coils were bigger than the height allowed to transit on Colombian highways, we had to recalculate another route to make the delivery."

Overcoming all these situations with very good cooperation, high-quality communication and excellent customer service, Anker Logistica and LEMAN have come together to make another set of shipments for the project a complete success.





C.H. Robinson News...



C.H. Robinson meets challenge to deliver large Wind Turbines

CH. Robinson Project Logistics recently assisted a valued customer with transporting 33 Clarge wind turbines from a distribution yard in Garden City, Kansas, to a new windfarm located near Kintyre, North Dakota. Their expert wind team worked tirelessly to organise the 680mi (1,100km) journey which required over 260 truckloads utilising 56 specialised trailers.

7 of the 33 wind turbines, including 3 blades, 3 tower sections, 1 machine head and 1 hub, were delivered as quickly as possible, with the additional 26 turbines delivered later. The project totalled 74,408cbm (6,531.2mtn) of cargo with the largest piece transported being the blade which measured a huge 50.20 x 2.92 x 3.64m.

More than 50 private police escorts were required to transport the OOG cargo (as per various state permit regulations) with 2 of C.H. Robinson's experienced project logistics experts, acting as an extension of their customer's team, present onsite to manage and oversee the aggressive delivery schedule to ensure the success of this enormous project.





C.H. Robinson delivers despite facing several obstacles

The team of experts at C.H. Robinson Project Logistics recently overcame several challenges to move two large debarking drum pieces. Together, the drums weighed 122.19mtn and they faced a challenging schedule as first, the shipper delayed the pickup by two weeks for welding and painting and then, because of the rescheduled pickup date, they faced the added challenge of hurricane Dorian's arrival.

The cargo was to be moved from Clearwater FL to Grayling MI and once the pickup was finally underway, the first drum was successfully loaded, transported, and delivered in six days. The planning and delivery of the second piece, which was 11.5 x 3.9 x 3.9m, did not go quite as smoothly as explained by C.H. Robinson:

The loading went well thanks to the onsite representation from C.H. Robinson during the process. Then, the first challenge arose; Due to the delayed pickup date, the project logistics team faced new construction in Michigan that required updated transportation routes and accordingly, different permits. Due to the processing time, it was unclear if the permits would be available before the drum reached the border. Transportation of the drum started off well, but in North Carolina, the brake booster bracket on the trailer broke as it was traveling up a mountain. Thanks to quick planning and clear communication, C.H. Robinson arranged a welder to the trailer's location within 30 minutes to assess the damage. Ultimately, the team needed to secure a push truck for the remainder of the trip, which also required additional permits. The breakdown caused a three-day delay but by the time the trailer reached the Michigan border, the revised permits due to construction routes had arrived and did not delay the load any further and the second drum successfully arrived without further complications."

Due to C.H. Robinson's quick but careful planning in the face of delays and transportation challenges, the customer was able to understand the benefit of working with a provider that can reliably meet their logistics services and technology needs, today and in the future.
